Mission Statement

To equip our students with knowledge and understanding, and enable them to view life from a biblical worldview that demands excellence in all areas of life in order to bring honor and glory to God.

Educational Philosophy

FaithHeritage Christian Academy has as its philosophical foundation the infallible Word of God. The goal of all education, according to 1 Corinthians 10:31 "*Whether therefore ye eat, or drink, or whatsoever ye do, do all to the glory of God.*", is to help man achieve life's purpose: to glorify God. As the explicit revelation of this God, whom men are to know and serve, the Word of God provides the primary instrument toward the goal of education. In light of this, emphasis must be placed on learning, understanding, applying, and memorizing the Scriptures during the school day.

According to Psalm 24:1, all of creation in all its aspects belongs to God. In Genesis 1:27-28, we are told that man was created in God's image and was given charge as a steward of this creation. In light of this charge, men are to be taught to understand the creation in all its aspects, not as an end in itself, but as a means to knowing and serving God. Hence, an effective education will expose students to the fullness of creation and give them skills necessary to

serve God as well as society. Since a true understanding of the world in which we live cannot be gained apart from knowledge of its Creator, all aspects of the educational curriculum should be **distinctly Christian**, taking into account God's revelation of Himself.

A primary portion of our service to God as outlined in both Exodus 20:1-17 and Matthew 19:19 is to center around loving our neighbors. To this end, a full education should include a substantial emphasis on acquiring and understanding the tools for communication and learning. In addition, students should understand the history and state of the culture within which they will serve God through their dealings with their neighbors.

Recognizing that parents have been given by God the basic responsibility of training and educating their children, FHCA *strongly encourages parents to be active in the instruction of their child(ren)*. Parents are to be aware of the process, content, and progress of their child's

education. Parents also may contribute to instruction in many ways. Lunch duty, substitute teaching, teaching a specialized subject such as art or music, helping with reading groups, serving with the parent-teacher organization, and being involved in field trips are some of the ways in which parents can be active in their child's education.

FHCA takes seriously the responsibility to choose its teachers carefully and support them properly in the school's endeavors. Since personal contact is the primary method of education, class sizes will be kept as small as practical, to insure attention to each student's educational needs. The needs and abilities of each child will be taken into account in the teaching process.

Tuition and Fees for 2026-2027

Registration Fee - \$500 per family

The Registration Fee for the first semester is \$500 and is due **June 1st** and is **NON-REFUNDABLE** except for family emergencies and with the authorization of the School Board.

Administration Fee - \$500 per family

The Administration Fee for the second semester is \$500 and is due by **August 1st** and is **NON-REFUNDABLE**. The Administration fee may be incorporated into your monthly tuition payment from January—May.

Technology Fee - There is a \$100 technology fee per family that can be incorporated into the monthly payments or paid in full by August 15th. This fee is used to purchase computers and the programs to go with them.

The tuition is \$5000 per student. This may be paid in 10 monthly payments of \$500. The initial payment is due no later than August 1st.

For families with multiple on-campus students-

2nd student \$1500 with payments of \$150 for ten months-

3rd student \$1000 with payments of \$100.00 for ten months.

4 or more children \$800 each with payments of \$80 for ten months.

If you would like to pay your tuition in full by August 1st ,you will receive a \$200 discount.

If you would like to pay tuition by semester, by August 1st and January 1st, you will receive a \$100 discount.

SENIOR GRADUATION NOTE: There will be an additional fee of \$100 for graduation expenses due by November 1, 2026.

DRESS CODE

FHCA will be adhering to the following dress code. For the safety of the students, we need to be able to identify students from outsiders. Uniforms are the best and easiest way.

Young ladies may wear *slacks, capris, jumpers, shorts, or skirts that are khaki, navy, or black*. Clothing should be comfortably fitting, and *all skirts and shorts must come to the knee*. Slacks, pants, shorts, etc. must be hemmed or cuffed with no holes. They should be plain or pleated fronts. If cargo pants are worn, they must be neat in appearance. All students will wear school approved polo shirts with the school emblem. *Leggings are only allowed if worn under skirts*.

Young men may wear slacks, or shorts that are khaki, navy, or black. Clothing should follow the same in appearance as for the young ladies excluding any reference to capris, jumpers or skirts.

Please wear shoes or boots that have closed toe and cover the heel. No sandals, flip flops, or house shoes. These are safety requirements from the Fire Marshall. Shoes must be worn at all times when present at school.

Outerwear policy change: All items of clothing worn over the school shirt must also be plain solid colors with the Faith Heritage Logo embroidered on them. This includes sweaters, button ups, jackets, and hoodies. Jackets and hoodies must be well fitting (not oversized covering up your shorts or skirts). The student must have their school shirt on at all times. The student's jacket is not an excuse to be out of dress code.

All clothing should be neat, clean, modest, and a positive representation of FHCA.

We will observe casual days this year. **We ask that all casual clothes worn to the school be modest in appearance, be solid in color with no letters, logos, pictures, or symbols.**

Breaking Casual Day Dress Code:

First Offense is a verbal warning, and student may be asked to turn shirt inside out, or call home for a change of clothing.

Second offense, the student must understand that he/she is choosing to not participate in the next week's casual day and will have to wear a school uniform.

Tank tops or any clothing that exposes a bare midriff or bare back or is considered immodest in any way is unacceptable.

Hats are permitted only outdoors and should be removed when you enter the building or a classroom.

General guidelines:

Clothing that is worn out, dirty, ripped, has holes or decorative patches; is extremely large and sloppy; or is see-through is unacceptable.

No shoes with wheels are allowed on campus.

Rain jackets may be worn on rainy days.

Visible tattoos are unacceptable.

No visible body piercings are acceptable.

Young men may not wear visible earrings or "extreme necklaces". One conservative necklace is permissible.

This dress code is given in order to provide some guidelines for acceptable and unacceptable dress and appearance. With changing fashions, it is impossible to print an exhaustive list of acceptable or unacceptable styles; therefore, students should understand the intent of these above all.

Parents and visitors are asked to conform to the casual dress code guidelines whenever they are on the school campus or at a school sponsored function. Thank you.

Your child will be sent home or the parent will be asked to bring a change of clothing up to school if they are not in dress code.

Dress Policy

The FHCA dress code is applicable for **all** students, both on-campus and off-campus, who come to the school campus at **any** time. Young ladies may wear slacks, capris, jumpers, shorts, and skirts; khaki, black, or navy in color. Skirts and shorts **must** cover the knees. Leggings are not an acceptable form of pant. Young men must wear slacks or shorts, khaki, black, or navy in color (with belts), and shorts **must cover the knees**. *(If you can see the knees, the clothing is too short.)* Slacks, pants, shorts, etc. must be hemmed or cuffed and plain or pleated front with no extra pockets or decorations. Young ladies and men must wear solid colored golf shirts (short or long sleeved). Shirts can be monogrammed for \$5.00. No open toe shoe, open heel shoes, sandals, or house shoes may be worn for safety reasons as per the fire marshal. Shoes must cover the toes and heels. Tennis shoes are preferred for foot-ware.

Outerwear: Jackets or hoodies must be solid colored with the school logo embroidered on them.
